

Power outages can be life-threatening if these devices stop working, so it's important to have a backup power plan. Options include portable generators, battery backups, or coordinating with local emergency services. Residents should also have enough oxygen supply to last at least 72 hours. Preparing in advance can ensure continuous care and provide peace of mind.
