Haunted Harvest: Sept. 19 at 7 p.m. Crafts, food, games, and more! Registration is required.

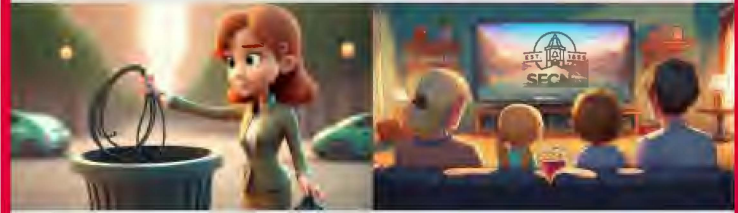
Adults

Options include portable generators, battery backups, or coordinating with local emergency services. Residents should also have enough oxygen supply to last at least 72 hours. Preparing in advance can ensure continuous care and provide peace of mind.
