Crack Seal Repair

You will often find the street crews out filling cracks in the roads during the colder months of the year.

These are the months that cracks are the widest. Crews first clear the cracks of rocks, dirt and debris with high pressure air, so please keep vehicles and trailers off the side of the road. Keep children away from the hot material during these operations.
