

Fun Shot Competition Saturday, January 25th Diamond Fork Middle School

4pm: 3rd and 4th grade 5pm: 5th and 6th grade 6pm: 7th through 12th grade

This event is open to the participants of Spanish Fork City's 2024-25 Junior Jazz program.

Participants should fill out the registration form posted online and bring it with them to the event. Registration forms will be provided at the event if a participant does not already have one completed.





How to Play:

- Each player will have one minute to score as many baskets as possible from any of the shooting spots identified on the game court
- Each shooting spot is worth a different point value, ranging from 2 to 5 points
- The top two finishers from each age group at the local competition will advance to the regional competition held in Pleasant Grove
- The first place finisher from each age group at the regional competition will advance to the final competition held at the Delta Center


Game Rules:

- On the game coordinator's signal, the player will begin their turn with ball in hand at the free throw line
- Scoring
 - The player can score up to two layups worth 2 points each during the one-minute competition (layups must be made within a three-foot radius of the basket)
 - Shots made from the free throw line are worth 3 points
 - Shots made from beyond the three-point line are worth 5 points
 - Three other shooting spots on the court vary in value, ranging from 2 to 4 points
- Bonus Points
 - o 5 bonus points will be awarded for attempting shots from all spots once
 - o 10 additional points will be awarded for attempting shots from all spots twice
 - Layup attempts are not required for bonus points
- Violations
 - The player must dribble from one shooting spot to another. 1 point will be deducted for each violation (palming, traveling, double-dribble)

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to participate in this competition?

- This event is open to the participants of Spanish Fork City's 2024-25 Junior Jazz program, from 3rd through 12th grade.

How many times should each participant shoot?

- Each participant will shoot two rounds.

Should the participants shoot all of their rounds consecutively?

- Participants should not be asked to shoot two or more rounds consecutively. They should be given at least a 15-minute break between rounds.

Will the winning score be the best individual round or a cumulative score of both rounds?

- The winning score will be the best cumulative score.

Will all age groups be shooting on a 10' hoop?

- Yes, all age groups will shoot on a 10' regulation hoop. The shooting spots for the 3rd and 4th grade participants are slightly closer to the baskets to accommodate for this.

Can participants use their own basketballs?

- Yes, participants are allowed to use their own balls. 3rd-4th boys, 5th-6th boys, and all four girls divisions will shoot with a 28.5 (women's size) ball. 7th-8th and 9th-12th boys will shoot with a 29.5 (full size) ball.

Are girls, 3rd-4th boys, and 5th-6th boys allowed to shoot with a full size basketball?

- Yes, they can shoot with a full size ball if they prefer.

Does the participant have to have both feet on the spot while shooting?

- The participant is not required to have both feet on the spot while shooting, but must have at least one foot touching the spot.

Can the participant shoot from the same spot several times consecutively?

- The participant is allowed to shoot from one spot as many times consecutively as they would like.

How many layups can the participant receive points for per round?

- The participant will only receive points for two made layups per round. They can shoot as many layups as they need to in order to make two.

Do layups count as a spot? Is the participant required to attempt layups in order to receive their bonus points?

- No, the layups do not count as a spot. The participant is not required to shoot or make layups to receive bonus points.

If the participant shoots from all spots twice, how many bonus points do they receive?

- If the participant shoots from each spot once, they will receive 5 bonus points. If they shoot from each spot twice, they will receive an additional 10 bonus points, for a total of 15 possible bonus points per round.

Should those administering the competition remind participants which spots they need to shoot from to get bonus points?

- The scorers, timer, and administrator should stay objective with all participants. They should not offer assistance on what spots the participant still needs to shoot from.

Are parents/spectators allowed to yell instructions to participants while they are shooting?

- Spectators are welcome to help the participant while they are shooting as long as they are in the stands. They are not allowed to come onto the court or other areas of the gym.

If the ball enters the stands, will the participant be allowed to start over?

- The participant is required to retrieve their own ball. They should continue their round even if their ball bounces out of play. In some cases, the head administrator may decide to reshoot the round based on extenuating circumstances.

If the ball bounces towards an observer, should they assist the participant and toss the ball back to them?

- If the ball that the participant is using during a live round comes toward a spectator, they should not throw it back to the participant. Ideally the spectator will move out of the way, but the most they should do is simply stop the momentum of the ball.

What if there is a tie?

- In the event of a tie for first place at the local competition, both participants will move on to the regional competition. In the event of a tie for second place, the game coordinator may facilitate a shoot off.
